This course provides an introduction to the specifics of language structure and sets linguistics in its context within cognitive science. After a general introduction to the nature and structure of language, we study the various components of language such as speech sounds (Phonetics and Phonology), words and their internal structure (Morphology), phrases and sentence structure (Syntax), and the meaning of words and sentences (Semantics).

There will be additional one-hour-tutorials for groups of around 25 participants. Regular attendance is compulsory. Details will be arranged in the first week of term.

In this course we will see how morphological theory rules out words like **dethroneless*, **Canadas goose* (plural), or **arrivable*. In short, we will discuss morphological principles that regulate word formation processes like derivation, compounding, inflection, and we will consider the interaction of morphology and argument structure. Moreover, we will take a look at the basic properties of Distributed Morphology, a recent morphological theory.

In this course we will first discuss basic semantic notions like the difference between sense and reference (e.g. the German chancellor vs. Angela Merkel), semantic classes of verbs/predicates, tense, aspect and modality. In the end we will be able to theoretically explain, for instance, why the English progressive is compatible with some verbs, but not with others: compare "John is driving a car" with "**John is owning a car*". In the second part of the course we will set the grounds for a formal approach to natural language semantics by determining the kind of objects words may refer to and how we can combine them to derive the interpretation of sentences. For this, we will introduce and make use of basic notions of set theory and predicate logic.

As its name suggests, the MP is not a theory but a mode of investigation, searching for a restricted core of deep abstract principles. Good knowledge of syntax is obligatory.

Any theory of the relation between the lexicon and the syntax must deal with two issues: first, how lexical entries are structured and organized; and second, the ways lexical information is made visible to syntax. The behavior of verbs is a particularly illuminating case to address the complex interaction between the syntax and the lexicon, especially because of the existence of argument alternations. Given that a noun phrase bearing a particular theta-role can appear in different syntactic positions for the same verb, we need to develop a theory of what controls this mapping. Argument alternations will thus play a central role in this class. In particular, this course investigates the following two questions: (a) how do we explain the limited set of argument structure types? and (b) how do lexical structures relate to syntactic structures?

This seminar starts by describing the basic ideas of Generative Phonology and then extends the analysis to a thorough examination of the relationship between phonological rules and representations by looking at various phonological processes in the languages of the world. This will allow us to discover specific phenomena (e.g. rule ordering, absolute neutralization etc.) that will provide us with insight into the general principles of phonological organization. The seminar also covers the representation of phonemes in the form of feature trees and connects phonological with morphological processes via Lexical Phonology.
