This course offers an introduction to the basic notions and methods of (generative) syntactic analysis, especially to various assumptions about the structure of sentences and different movement operations. Among the topics to be discussed are subject positions, cases of subject inversion, verbal syntax, passives, and questions. The course should enable students to identify different syntactic phenomena, to get an insight into syntactic argumentation and to enhance their skills of formulating and testing hypotheses.

Pragmatics is usually defined study of language use. This includes context-dependent aspects of language structure as well as aspects that have little to do with this structure. In this class you will be introduced to the major phenomena discussed in this discipline, namely deixis, conversational implicature, presuppositions, speech acts and discourse structure.

The course is concerned with the formal analysis and expression of linguistic meaning. The course will introduce the basics of linguistic semantics and (formal) semantic theory, covering semantic notions of time (tense and aspect), participants in situations (thematic roles), context and inference, and propositional logic.

PS Syntactic Theory

**Silke FISCHER****FR 09.45 – 11.15****17.12**

In this course we will see how syntactic theory can account for the ungrammaticality of sentences like the following:

- (1) \*It seems syntax to be fascinating
- (2) \*It is reluctant that Martin will do syntax.
- (3) \*Who do you think that will pass the test?
- (4) \*How do you wonder what we will discuss?

In short, we will discuss all kinds of movement phenomena, control theory, and empty categories. Moreover, we will be concerned with binding, theta and Case theory. Good basic knowledge of syntax is obligatory.

PS Language Evolution

In 1866, the *Société de Linguistique de Paris* banned all discussion about the evolution of language because the questions raised were considered unanswerable. From the 1950s on the subject slowly gained more acceptance, yet it took some more decades for the first institutes of evolutionary linguistics to emerge.

Language leaves no fossils, this makes it a very hard task to track down its origin. However, some understanding of language evolution can come from including other (sub)disciplines such as psycholinguistics, neuroscience, biology, anthropology etc. In this course, we will look at some of these fields of research in order to get a basic understanding of the origin and evolution of language.

**Matthias JILKA****Mo 09.45 – 11.15****11.62**

In this second part of the Introduction to Phonetics and Phonology we will deal with two remaining areas of phonetics, namely those concerned with the transmission (Acoustic Phonetics) and the reception/perception (Auditory Phonetics) of speech. The latter subject introduces us to the study of the suprasegmental characteristics of speech, i.e. Prosody. Finally, aspects of rhythmic and syllabic structure will be addressed in Metrical Phonology.

In this course we will be concerned with the problem of language contact, a situation that arises when speakers of different languages interact closely. Our main interest will be to investigate how the grammars of the respective languages are affected when this arises and the consequences of this interaction for theories of language, language contact and syntax.

This course will focus on word-formation processes such as nominalization, and participle formation. These phenomena will be discussed in the light of recent developments in morphological theory.

This course will examine the syntactic and semantic properties of noun phrases. It will pay particular attention to the semantic characterization of mass nouns (water), bare plurals (books) and proper names (John) and their structural realization.

Neurolinguistics aims to describe the relationship between the anatomy of the brain and linguistic function. You will be introduced to different concepts that aim to describe this relationship. A major part of the seminar will be covered by the study of aphasia as these disorders demonstrate the specific functions of particular brain areas. Modern methods of brain imaging will also be part of the class.
