It is not only what we say that matters, but also how we say it. The course deals with sentence melody and its linguistic functions, such as encoding sentence mode, syntactic phrasing, and information structure. The aims of the course are: to make students aware of the forms and functions of sentence intonations, to familiarize them with the inventory of intonational tones and tunes in English, to present the theoretical frameworks of intonation (such as the British School and autosegmental-metrical theories of intonation like ToBi), and to introduce ways of transcribing the speech melody of a sentence.

Furthermore, we discuss how syntactic operations are affected by prosodic factors.

This course offers a comprehensive introduction to the linguistic structure of Bantu languages. Bantu languages, spoken by an estimated 240 million speakers in 27 African countries, are one of the most important language groups in Africa in terms of geographical and demographic spread.

In this course we are looking in more detail at the most salient structural properties of Bantu languages, such as the noun class system, agreement and verbal morphology. The focus, however, will be on phonological aspects, such as palatalization, vowel harmony and tone. The language to be studied in detail is Tswana, a Bantu language spoken in South Africa and Botswana.
