- the formal level: from word classes and phrasal categories to complete tree structures, and thereby we will deal with various syntactic phenomena, both on the phrasal and on the sentential level. The seminar has a strong practical focus; the students will learn to apply syntactic argumentation themselves.

This course offers an overview of the historical development of generative syntax and an introduction to various assumptions about clause structure and different movement operations. Among the topics to be discussed are subject positions, verbal syntax, Case theory, passives, raising constructions, questions and binding theory. The course should enable students to identify different syntactic phenomena and to get an insight into syntactic analysis and argumentation.

Moreover, we will take a look at the basic properties of Distributed Morphology, a recent morphological theory.

In short, we will discuss all kinds of movement phenomena, control theory, and empty categories. Moreover, we will be concerned with binding, theta and Case theory. Good basic knowledge of syntax is obligatory.

Binding theory is concerned with the distribution of nominal phrases like definite descriptions (the boy), proper names (John), pronouns (he, she, him, her) and anaphors (himself, herself, each other).

From introductory classes, students should be familiar with the Binding Principles A, B and C which regulate the possible distributions of these elements as shown in the examples below.

1. John(i) likes himself(i)/*him(i)
2. John(i) thinks that Mary likes *himself(i)/him(i)
3. *He(i) thinks that Mary likes John(i)

In this class, we will read (i) papers that further develop the insight from the classical Principles A, B and C and (ii) papers which use the insights about Binding Phenomena to investigate other aspects of syntactic theory.
