Among the topics to be discussed are phrase structure, subject positions, verbal syntax, passives, and questions. The course should enable students to identify different syntactic phenomena, to get an insight into syntactic argumentation and to enhance their skills of formulating and testing hypotheses.

- (3) *Who do you think that will pass the test?

In short, we will be concerned with all kinds of movement phenomena, Case & control theory, and empty categories. Finally, we will try to catch up with current syntactic research and discuss the core ideas of Minimalism. Good basic knowledge of syntax is obligatory (ideally, a G3 Introduction to syntax should have already been attended).

PS Basic Phonetics and Phonology II

In this continuation of the introduction to phonetics and phonology, we will deal with the two remaining areas of phonetics, namely Acoustic and Auditory Phonetics. We will then also study the suprasegmental aspects of speech, in particular rhythmic structure (esp. syllable and foot structure of English), word accent and intonation.

Basic familiarity with morphological analysis will be assumed, and some background in syntax and phonology, while not required, will be helpful.

By looking at data from many languages, we will study both the instruments and formal means that phonology has at its disposal, but also the most important phonological phenomena (feathering and bleeding, abstract underlying representations, feature trees etc.). Time permitting we will also include autosegmental and metrical phonology.

This course is about the comparative examination of the grammatical properties (syntax and morphology) of the languages of the world. We will try to discover how languages differ from each other, what the range of variation is, which grammatical properties are common and which are rare, and what is shared by all languages (universals). The course will discuss grammatical phenomena that are "exotic" from the point of view of English, but often found in other languages. Students attending this course will have to carry out a little investigation on an exotic language and present the findings in class.

HS Topics in Comparative Germanic Syntax

Thomas McFADDEN**MI 15.45 – 17.15****7.003**

This course will consider a series of syntactic phenomena found in the Germanic languages which pose puzzles and problems for theories of syntax and language comparison. For each phenomenon we will consider a selection of different theoretical approaches that have been proposed and work toward a critical understanding of their relative strengths and weaknesses. Among the topics considered will be verb-second, relative order of verb and object, verb raising, scrambling, interactions between case and subjecthood and the structure of the DP. Languages discussed will include English, German, Dutch, Icelandic, Yiddish, Danish, Swedish and Norwegian. Prerequisite is at least one course in syntax at the G3 or G4 level.
