Optimality Theory (OT) is an approach to linguistic analysis which originated in phonology in the early 1990s but was soon taken up in syntax, morphology, and other fields of linguistics as well (cf. Prince & Smolensky 1993). In contrast to many other models, it does not presuppose that linguistic rules must strictly be obeyed (or otherwise the result will be ungrammatical) – instead, OT assumes that principles are violable and ranked in a language-specific hierarchy. Thus, a grammatical form may violate a constraint X if all alternative forms come off worse with respect to a higher-ranked (i.e. more important) constraint Y. As illustration, consider an example from everyday life: the priority system for driving (cf. Müller 2002):

right before left (RbL): If you come from the right, you have the right of way.

green traffic lights (gTL): If the traffic lights are green, you have the right of way.

Scenario: Driver A and B meet at an intersection. B comes from the right, but A has green traffic lights.

Result: If the two rules RbL and gTL are in conflict with each other, the latter is considered to be more important, i.e. it is higher ranked, and as a result driver A will have the right of way (even if he comes from the left).

The aim of this course is to make students familiar with the basics of OT and discuss various OT analyses.
